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III. Finance Report	Terri Weems provided an updated set of financials. DESC's net position of \$5M is relatively unchanged; it's about \$400,000 less.	
	Terri provided an update on the Financial Statement Audit and the Single Audit. The financial statement audit provided an opportunity to identify controlled improvements. (The single Audit reviewed PATH and WIOA). No issues over the last couple of years.	
	 DESC has a new controlled improvement opportunity around bank reconciliations which includes: Completed timely Reconciling items need to be resolved in a timely manner 	
	 Tax status update: A received ruling from the IRS DESC is currently a Public Charity, formally a private foundation Classified as an organization, exempt from Federal Income Tax 	
	 Kristin Hunt, Plante Moran reported on the following: 2019 Financial statement Audit Federal Compliance Grant Audit

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	Alessia Giles reported on the Updated Budget:	
	In June 2019 DESC board approved the FY20 budget in the amount of \$67,791,262 back in June 2019. As of October 2019 DESC, has realized a net budget increase of \$3,539, 421. This increase is the result of the following grants:	
	 WIOA SW DW Retail Grant \$1,273,719 This grant was not included in the original FY20 grant as it was received later in FY19. DESC did not incur any expenditures during FY19, and the entire amount is being included in FY20 and has been allocated to participant training. 	
	 Ford Motor Company \$1,000,000 This allocation was received from the Ford Motor Company and has been allocated to participant training. 	
	 3. PATH Carry-In \$1,765,702 a. DESC received an additional allocation of PATH funding later in the grant period; the state allowed DESC to carry-over this amount to 12/31/2019. b. Furthermore, DESC had subcontractors that did not expend their entire award, and the state allowed DESC to carry-over 8% of those funds. c. \$1,515,702 will be allocated to a subcontractor, and \$250,000 has been allocated to training. 	
	4. CDBG GDYT decreased by \$500,000	
	Terri Weems reported on the background of this funding reduction: We have enjoyed CDBG funding over the past several years; we recently became aware that the city of Detroit needs to certified community-based organizations to administer the GDBG funds. There was only one organization that was identified as a certified CBO (community-based organization) that could qualify for CBDG funding. (only one organization could qualify) We were limited in the number of dollars we could expend of the full CDBG award, which reduced the award to 1M of 1.5M.

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IV. New Business	Nicole Sherard-Freeman shared information on the process of establishing our next Career Technical Education Center with either Southeastern or Golightly. There was a discussion with Southeastern to add Robotics or Mechatronics, welding, and CNC machining. FCA is making a significant investment. Ric Preuss added that Chrysler is hiring for a new plant and hiring 110 electricians amongst all the other trades.
